## Motions/topics/focus:

The meeting was moderated by Tijana Ljuboje, who presented the agenda items at the beginning:

1. Performance analysis of Debatology for June
2. Proposing topics for the upcoming period

### 1. Performance analysis of Debatology topics for June

Within the first agenda item it was pointed out that there is an increasing activity in Debatology, evidenced by the greatly enlarged number of comments and visits. It was pointed out that in June there was a tight battle for the best internet debater, after which a list of weekly and monthly winners was presented. In the first competitive week, the winner was user „sm“. In the second and third week, the winner was „Coraco“, and in the last competitive week, the winner was „Predator“. With two wins, „Coraco“ became the best debater. The editor of internet portal Studomat.ba said that „Coraco“ was the best debater for April as well, and that his win is a proof that Debatology has justified the expectation and that the visits are not one-timed, but that participants continuously participate in the debates.

Nadina Balagić pointed out that the topics for June were devoted to the current issues related to young people, both in BiH and EU. The topics were about: the qualifying exams, the relationship between university and labor market, the modus of examinations, hiring professors in several universities at the same time, copyright on books and internet applying for exams. Associate for selection and proposal of debate topics explained that those topics are very important in EU countries as well, and that the debates contributed to creating parallels between educational systems in BiH and EU.

Anesa Vilić said that Facebook group dedicated to Debatology is also very active, and that in June there were 50 new members.

### 2. Proposing topics for the upcoming period

Tijana Ljuboje called the present administrators to propose the content for the topics about EU for the upcoming period. Amer Musić pointed out that the topics for the next period should be dedicated to the

current political issues in EU, with special emphasis on foreign policy. All participants accepted the proposal. Nadina Balagić pointed out that part of the topics should be dedicated to the important issues for young people. After all administrators presented their ideas for the topics, Tijana Ljuboje asked them if there were any unanswered questions or ambiguities in regard with the meetings. Participants responded that the obligations for the next period are very clear, which formally ended the meeting.
